

Overview of Duck Beach Erosion & Its Potential Fiscal Impact

1. *Map Index*
2. *Map Series One* – Shoreline data and average annual erosion rates calculated from North Carolina Division of Coastal Management (DCM) historical shoreline data
3. *Map Series Two* – Shoreline data and average annual erosion rates calculated from Dare County and USDA Digital Orthophotos (1996-2010)
4. *Map Series Three* – Low Erosion Scenario - Projection of the future first line of stable natural vegetation using the DCM Average Annual Erosion Rates (Map Series One). Colored lines west of the 2010 First Line of Stable Natural Vegetation (FLSNV) depict the projected FLSNV location for 10, 20, and 30 year time horizons.
5. *Map Series Four* – Medium Erosion Scenario - Projection of the future first line of stable natural vegetation using the factor established by the North Carolina Division of Coastal Management to determine structural setbacks. Colored lines west of the 2010 First Line of Stable Natural Vegetation (FLSNV) depict the projected FLSNV location for 10, 20, and 30 year time horizons. For the Town of Duck, the setback factor is two feet per year or three feet per year in limited locations.
6. *Map Series Five* – High Erosion Scenario - Projection of the future first line of stable natural vegetation using a combination of the DCM setback factor (Map Series Four) or the Average Annual Erosion Rates calculated from the data in Map Series Two. The projected shorelines were calculated using the higher of the two rates for each transect. Colored lines west of the 2010 First Line of Stable Natural Vegetation (FLSNV) depict the projected FLSNV location for 10, 20, and 30 year time horizons.
